- Description: Join us for a hands-on feedback session introducing Dash, our AI-powered browser homepage that helps First-Gen students stay organized, engaged, and connected to TRIO support, and Advocado, our new advocacy tool that turns TRIO data into personalized, year-round storytelling for state and federal stakeholders. We'll demo both tools, share early insights from pilots, and invite participants to shape upcoming features.
- Presenter Bio: Jonathan Muruako is the Founder & CEO of Fitalyst, Gates Millennium Scholar, and proud TRIO Alum. A First-Gen, Low-Income graduate who earned four degrees from the University of Pennsylvania, Jonathan built Dash and Advocado based on his lived experience navigating college without a roadmap. He has worked with TRIO programs across multiple states, led pilots serving more than 500 students, and specializes in behavioral science, learning analytics, and culturally responsive design for underserved learners.

Description:	In this reflective and interactive session, participants will explore what true leadership means beyond titles and tasks. Peeling back the curtain, this session will explore the many roles that leaders must fulfill to meet the mission and needs of their organization. Throughout the workshop, attendees will: (1) engage in thoughtful discussion and self- reflection to identify the core principles that shape how they lead; (2) examine how experiences-both professional and personal-inform one's leadership style; and (3) explore practical ways to "show up" for others in alignment with one's values.
Presenter Bio:	Kimberly Jones is the President of the Council for Opportunity in Education. As president, she serves as the primary liaison between the Council and the United States Congress, the Executive Branch, and all other postsecondary education associations. Additionally, she oversees the organization's professional development offerings for college access and success educators; scholarly and experiential learning opportunities for low-income, first-generation students; and the research agenda of COE's Pell Institute for the Study of Higher Education. A Harry S. Truman Scholar, Ms. Jones, a graduate of Yale University and the Georgetown University Law Center. In 2016, the National Bar Association recognized Ms. Jones as one of the "40 Under 40 Nation's Best Advocates" and received their Excellence in Activism Award. In 2018, she was selected for the Diversity Executive Leadership Program sponsored by ASAE, the American Society of Association Executives. In 2021, she earned the Certified Association Executive (CAE) credential from ASAE.

Session: Dialogue as Practice: Empowering Dreams and Transforming Lives Through Holistic Critical Mentoring in TRIO

Presenter: Dr. Michael Hunt, Director, UMBC McNair Scholars

Description: This interactive workshop reframes from dialogue as a transformative practice that shapes how students experience belonging, possibility, and support within TRIO programs. Grounded in Holistic Critical Mentoring (HCM), a research-based framework developed through work with McNair and other access-oriented initiatives, this session explores how intentional dialogue can affirm student aspirations while transforming mentoring, advising, and program design. Participants will engage in facilitated dialogic tools, including community agreements, reflective dialogue, and coaching circles, to examine how dialogue currently functions in their TRIO contexts.

Presenter Bio: Rev. Dr. Michael A. Hunt is an advocate, educator, and administrator from Baltimore dedicated to promoting inclusive, equity-centered practices in higher education. He holds a bachelor's degree in applied mathematics from UMBC and a Master of Divinity from Emory University. Michael serves as Director of the UMBC McNair Scholars Program, expanding pathways to doctoral education for underrepresented students. A proud McNair alum, he earned his Ph.D. in Language, Literacy, and Culture from UMBC. His research emphasizes Holistic Critical Mentoring, a framework he advocates to help students and institutions reimagine how mentorship can affirm identity, foster self-efficacy, and create equitable academic cultures. His work encourages institutions, rather than just students, to transform through equity-focused practices, institutional accountability, and co-conspiratorial leadership. A nationally recognized expert in educational access and mentoring, Michael co-founded A&M Hunt Consulting, LLC with his wife, Ariel. They are proud parents of Imani Brielle.

Description: This training focuses on preparing emerging TRIO leaders to sustain and advance the TRIO legacy. Participants will examine the historical foundations of successful TRIO programs and the leadership practices that have supported long-term program impact.

The session emphasizes succession planning as a critical strategy in response to the anticipated retirement of experienced TRIO leaders and the need to prepare current staff for leadership transitions. Through discussion and practical application, participants will learn how to assess leadership readiness, identify talent, and develop intentional succession plans aligned with staff credentials, competencies, and professional development opportunities. Attendees will gain tools to ensure continuity, stability, and sustainability within TRIO programs.
